



## Welcome to Premium Economy

This brief guide takes you through the features and functions of your **Spaceseat**. You'll notice that the seats to the sides of the cabin are different to those in the centre. Designed for travellers on their own or as couples, the seats operate in much the same way.

#### 1 Seat recline and tilt

For extra comfort your seat can recline and tilt. You'll find the lever for seat recline next to your knee. Slide yourself forward while remaining in your seat. This manual recline requires you to shift your body weight forward. Release the lever.

The tilt function is designed to support you in the seat. The tilt lever is next to the recline lever. Adjust your lower back into the desired position while pulling this lever.

#### 2 Headrest

Your headrest has been designed to move up and down behind your neck for best comfort.

#### 3 Foot bean bag

The foot bean bag has been designed to elevate your feet to the resting position that best suits you. We found that by removing your shoes and putting the ball of your heel deeply into the centre, your feet are well supported and nestled. Used in conjunction with the tilt/recline function on your seat, the foot bean bag offers great comfort.

#### 4 Centre seat console

In the centre seats, you'll find a height adjustable console. In the upright position, it serves as an armrest, an area to spread out and a shared table. In the lowered position, it's great for spreading out and relaxing. It also contains a useful stowage container.

To raise, grab the lever at the front centre of the console, while lifting at the same time. You may need to use your other hand to lift. Release the lever when raised to lock in place.

To lower the console, grab the handle and gently lower back to the downward position.

The console must be in the lowered position for taxi, take off and landing.

#### 5 Stowage

Convenient stowage for small items such as reading glasses or an MP3 player is available in addition to your seat pocket.

The release button for this stowage can be found next to your knee. Simply press the button while lifting the padded lid.

The location of the release button for stowage on the outboard seats is found between passengers and on the aisle side.

Below your tray table is a full sized literature pocket, useful for storing magazines, a drink bottle and other items you may need to hand.

#### 6 Tray table

Your tray table has been designed to give you more surface space as and when you need it. To release your table, press the button below your monitor. The table is a convenient half table size, ideal for resting a drink or snack while giving you plenty of room to move around. The table can be brought closer to you by rotating and pulling it towards you. When you need a larger surface area for dining or a laptop for example, simply flip over the top surface to double the table size.

#### 7 Monitor

Your Inflight Entertainment monitor is adjustable to give you the best viewing position you can watch while leaving it stowed. To release the monitor, press the square button on the right, just in front of you. From here, you can swing the monitor in to the most convenient viewing position. You can also tilt the monitor up and down.

#### 8 Handset

Your handset can be found next to you. This has Inflight Entertainment controls, lighting and call buttons. Remember, your screen can also be controlled by your touch so keep your handset stowed when not in use.

#### 9 Lighting

Reading lights are both overhead, controlled from your handset or next to your shoulder for directional light. Press the top half of the circle and rotate to direct the light.

#### 10 Inseat power, USB and iPod jacks

Your seat has been equipped with power to charge electrical items such as phones, laptops and MP3 players for most plug types. You'll also find a USB jack and iPod jack so that you can view content through your Inflight Entertainment monitor. You'll notice that the iPod jack looks different to the one you're used to. You can order an iPod cable through your Inflight Entertainment screen.

#### 11 Headphone jack

Your headphone is conveniently located just forward of your armrest.

#### 12 Life vest

Your life vest is found under your seat.

# Getting the best from your Premium Economy Spaceseat experience

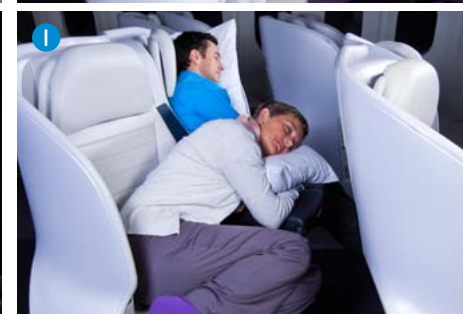
Your Premium Economy seat has been designed to give you an exclusive use area that no one else reclines into and there's no armrest sharing – it's your space. The seat, a large blanket combined with a generous feather pillow and the foot bean bag which you choose the position of to suit your size, provides everything you need to get really comfortable.

Where traditional Premium Economy seats create a situation of sleeping with a straight body (planking), the Spaceseat has recline and tilt functions as well as your own personal shell to cocoon into with your pillow so you can get your body and importantly your head into a comfortable sleeping position. In fact, your seat now provides over 50% more fixed personal space compared with a traditional economy style seat. No longer will the seat in front recline into you.

Spaceseat allows you to find the best resting position for your body. You can lean into either side of your seat shell, or turn 90 degrees and lie on the seat sideways using your pillow to get really comfortable. At your feet, you'll find a foot bean bag (or in front rows it's in the overhead lockers for use after takeoff). It's a flexible bean bag which you can shape with your foot just for your personal comfort.

We've included some sleep positions to help you get the most comfortable rest, whether travelling alone, or with a partner. Try some and find the one that's right for you.

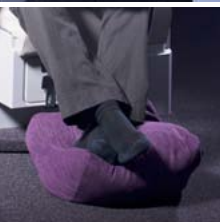

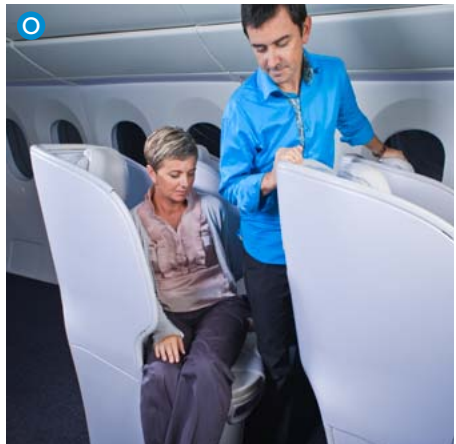
